#### Hill Evacuation Information

On January 4, 2015 Al Watson from CADS worked with the Calabogie Ski Patrol to conduct a practice lift evacuation. Many thanks to the ski patrol and the ski school staff that helped on a very cold day.

It was success and the photo beside is one of the sit skis being lower to the ground. It was an excellent opportunity to work with the Ski Patrol and Calabogie Mountain to ensure that everything would run smoothly if we have to execute a real evacuation. It is very unlikely we will ever have to do this but far better to be prepared and able to evacuate as fast and as safely as possible.

They lowered a Mountain man and a

bi-ski HOC that let them evaluate and adjust technical requirements for the different set ups of the different sit skis. Safety is exceptionally important and we are pleased with the results of the event.
